

<u>Communication and Language</u> Learning to listen carefully to stories, asking and answering questions, and retelling simple narratives. Developing key social phrases and building confidence in speaking through activities like show and tell.	<u>Physical Development</u> Building fine motor skills through activities like threading, using playdough, and making snips in paper with two-hole scissors. Beginning to form the letters in our names correctly. Focusing on gross motor development during PE sessions by moving confidently and safely in space through activities such as ball games.	<u>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</u> Recognising ourselves as unique individuals by sharing hobbies and interests. Learning to name and understand feelings through stories and the Zones of Regulation. Introducing classroom rules and exploring what kind and respectful behaviour looks like in different areas of the classroom.
